





# Explanatory Statement pursuant to Section 102(1) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act")

The following Statement set out all material facts relating to Item No.3 to 7 mentioned in the accompanying Notice.

#### Item No. 3 and 4:

Our Company was incorporated on 27.03.2007 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The existing Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association are as per the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956. The Board of Directors at their meeting held on 26.06.2023 recommended to the Members for adoption of new set of Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association as per the Companies Act, 2013.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their relatives is interested in the above resolution.

The Board recommends the resolution set forth in Item No.3 and 4 of the Notice for approval of the Members.

### Item No. 5:

As per the notification no. RBI/2022-23/128 dt. 11.10.2022 of the Reserve Bank of India, the Minimum Net Owned Fund of an ARC is increased from the existing ₹100 crore to ₹200 crore by March 2024 and ₹300 crore by March 2026.

The existing Authorised Share Capital of the Company is ₹150 crores (1,50,00,000 shares @ ₹100 each) and Paid-up Share Capital is ₹100 crores. Our net owned fund as on 31.03.2023 is ₹137.43 crores. The Board of Directors recommend to increase the Authorised Share Capital to ₹200 crores to comply with the revised guidelines of the RBI.

None of the Directors, Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their relatives is interested in the above resolution.

The Board recommends the resolution set forth in Item No. 5 of the Notice for approval of the Members.

### Item No. 6 and 7:

Sri. Ch. Rama Prasad was appointed as Chief Executive Officer of the Company from 24.11.2016. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 149, 161(1) and other applicable provisions, if any, of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act") and the Rules made thereunder, Sri. Ch. Rama Prasad (DIN No. 07030015) who was appointed by the Board of Directors, with the approval of the Reserve Bank of India, as Additional Director of the Company with effect from 11.04.2023 who holds office up to the conclusion of this Annual General Meeting. The Company had received consent letter from Sri. Rama Prasad to act as a Director, Managing Director & CEO of the Company.

Sri Ch. Rama Prasad is not disqualified from being appointed as Director in terms of Section 164 of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended from time to time.

In terms of Section 160 of the Companies Act, 2013, the Company has received notice in writing from a Member proposing his candidature to be appointed as Director and Managing Director & CEO of the Company as per the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

## **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

To the Members,

Your Directors are pleased to present the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Report together with the audited statements of accounts of the Company for the financial year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023.

## **Financial Results**

The performance of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2023 is summarized below:

TThe Company's gross income for the financial year ended 31st March, 2023 is ₹3591.90 lakhs as against ₹3311.56 lakhs in the previous year. Profit Before Tax (PBT) is ₹888.45 lakhs and net profit after tax for the year is ₹650.42 lakhs as against ₹2116.32 lakhs and ₹1581.86 lakhs respectively in the previous year.

The Company's net worth as on 31st March, 2023 stood at ₹13779.55 lakhs.

### **Dividend**

Considering the Reserve Bank of India's directive to increase the Net Owned Funds of the Company to ₹200 crores by 31st March, 2024, your directors have taken a conscious decision to retain the profit earned in business and hence dividend is not proposed for the financial year ended 31st March, 2023.

### **Transfer to Reserves**

Your Directors approved to transfer ₹500 lakhs to General Reserve and ₹350 lakhs to Debenture Redemption Reserve for FY 2022-23 The net surplus of ₹1429.55 lakhs is retained in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

## **Share Capital**

There is no change in the capital structure of the Company during FY 2022-23.

## Performance of the Company

A summary of the debts acquired and realized during FY 2022-23 is given below. A detailed analysis of the performance of the Company is discussed in the management discussion and analysis.

## **Management Discussion and Analysis**

Acquisitions: During FY 2022-23, ARCs acquired the debt of ₹1,78,283 crores at an acquisition cost of ₹37,267 crores. Your Company placed bids for a bid value of ₹802 crores and was successful in acquiring debt of ₹5495.27 crores at an acquisition cost of ₹722.27 crores, of which Corporate and MSME loans account for ₹486.31 crores and retail loans are acquired at an acquisition cost of ₹235.96 crores. The acquisitions in the previous year amounted to ₹443.44 crores.

During FY 2022-23, your company was successful in acquiring part debt of a large corporate from 2 ARCs at an acquisition cost of ₹460.50 crores on cash basis. The debt was structured into Class A and B category security receipts. Two investment firms partnered in the acquisition by subscribing to 85% of security receipts. In the present scenario of asset reconstruction business such large value assets are available for acquisition on cash basis from Banks and Fls. The management of your Company is confident of closing more deals in the days to come with investor participation. Since your Company has made a beginning in acquisition of large value assets, the process would continue in the current year also, subject to maintaining capital to risk assets ratio as per guidelines.

During FY 2022-23, your Company has forayed into acquisition of retail assets. The Company shall focus on this segment since assets are sold on SR basis and thereby fund requirement is less. Moreover, in most of the cases, lenders supplement efforts in recovery of loans.

**Recoveries:** During FY 2023, the economy of the Country has recovered fully from the pandemic and post pandemic after affects. Most of the economic indices have come back to pre-pandemic levels. Manufacturing and services sectors have surpassed pre-pandemic levels indicating good growth prospects in these sectors.

FY 2022-23 has been a remarkable year for your Company in terms of recovery of debts. The recovery in accounts amounted to ₹910.52 crores as against ₹88.67 crores in the previous year. The debt of a large corporate, acquired in the previous year was fully resolved in FY 2022-23 through a resolution process under IBC. Further, in most of the retail loan portfolios there is a regular flow of recoveries and this has facilitated deployment of funds in a judicious manner. The recoveries resulted in partial redemption in 14 trust accounts amounting to ₹124.99 crores and full redemption in 11 trust accounts, amounting to ₹520.59 crores.



Profitability: During FY 2022-23 the gross revenue was ₹35.92 crores (₹33.12 crores in the previous year). The profit before tax was ₹8.88 crores and net profit after tax ₹6.50 crores. In-spite of higher revenue, the profit before tax has reduced compared to previous year due to higher finance cost and increase in provisioning requirements on security receipts in trust accounts, as per RBI guidelines. During the year your Company had to provide for ₹14.26 crores towards technical write off and provisions in certain accounts to comply with the guidelines of the Reserve Bank of India (₹4.24 crores in the previous year). The Management of your Company is making efforts to recover amounts in accounts where security receipts were written off or provisions made in earlier years.

### ARC Industry Outlook: Recommendations of the Committee set up by the Reserve Bank of India:

The Reserve Bank of India had, in April 2021, set up a six-member committee under the Chairmanship of Sri. Sudarshan Sen, former Executive Director, RBI. The scope of the Committee was to review the legal and regulatory framework, business models of ARCs and to recommend measures to improve efficacy, resolution of stressed assets including under IBC, to improve liquidity in and trading of SRs and other matters relating to transparency and governance of ARCs. The Committee had submitted its recommendations to the RBI in September 2021 and basing on the recommendations of the Committee, the RBI, in October 2022 issued revised guidelines on matters relating to corporate governance and certain operational issues. A few of them which have a bearing on your Company's working are discussed below.

- 1. Tenure of MD / CEO or WTD shall not be for more than five years at a time and the post cannot be held by the same incumbent for more than fifteen years continuously.
- 2. No person shall continue as MD / CEO or WTD beyond the age of 70 years.
- 3. The Chairperson of the Board shall not be a member of the Audit Committee.
- 4. Settlement of dues with borrowers shall be done only after the proposals are examined by an Independent Advisory Committee which shall consist of professionals having technical / finance / legal background.
- 5. The settlement amount should be in accordance with guidelines issued on the Net Present Value of settlement amount.
- 6. The present minimum Net Owned Fund (NOF) for ARCs is ₹100 crores. ARCs are required to achieve a minimum NOF of ₹200 crores by 31st March, 2024 and ₹300 crores by 31st March, 2026.
- 7. ARCs are permitted to deploy available surplus funds in short term instruments, viz., money market mutual funds, certificates of deposit, corporate bonds / commercial paper which have a short-term rating equivalent to long term rating of AA- or above.
- 8. ARCs are permitted to invest in SRs at a minimum of either 15% of the transferor's investment in SRs or 2.5% of the total SRs issued, whichever is higher.

The Board of your Company has put in place modifications in policy documents to ensure compliance with the revised guidelines.

In line with the corporate governance initiatives, Sri. M. Gopala Krishnaiah, Whole-time Director, demitted office on 10<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 and Sri. Ch. Rama Prasad, Chief Executive Officer is designated as Managing Director and CEO w.e.f. 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2023. The Board of your Company has also approved to increase the authorized share capital of the Company from the existing ₹150 crores to ₹200 crores and necessary resolutions are placed before the Members for approval.

While the stipulation that ARCs need to invest 2.5% of the total SRs issued when the selling bank / FI is not participating in the acquisition, is a welcome feature and provides relief to ARCs, increasing the NOF from ₹100 crore to ₹300 crore in a glide path is a tough norm to comply, particularly for smaller ARCs in the context of reduced margins and increased time lines for resolution of debts.

## **Future Prospects:**

On asset acquisition, two issues which have been hindering the business of ARCs are sale of assets on cash basis and fixation of high reserve prices by seller banks. On the resolutions front delays in resolving legal issues is the major stumbling block. The Sudarshan Sen Committee appointed by the RBI has not made any recommendations in the direction of providing relief to ARCs in these areas. It is necessary that individual ARCs align their strategies to suit the present trends in industry. The Asset Reconstruction companies should associate and partner with FPIs, AFIs and large fund houses, not only for resource mobilization but also to achieve higher profitability through suitable debt restructure mechanism. The traditional way of acquiring assets on SR basis and resolution through legal measures is fast disappearing. Acquisition of debts with a proper resolution / restructuring plan with a time bound exit route in the backdrop is the order of the day. The smaller ARCs must acquire skills in this direction to sustain their profitability levels.

## **Risk Management**

In the context of Asset Reconstruction Companies, the following 4 key challenges emerge, namely:

- 1. Availability of resources for acquisitions
- 2. Acquisition of assets at reserve prices fixed by selling banks
- 3. Resolution of stressed assets on account of delays in resolving legal issues
- 4. Lack of well-developed vibrant market for distressed assets

Your Company has acquired large value assets through issue of NCDs and resolved the debts. Your company is confident of making more such deals which would help in acquisition of large value accounts. The prudent and cautious approach of the Company while raising resources and in placing bids will minimize risk in acquisition of stressed assets at realistic values.

Despite stringent provisions under SARFAESI Act and IB Code, resolutions are not taking place at the expected pace at the ground level. This is due to the attitude of the borrowers to litigate continuously. In DRTs and DRATs also matters are pending for a very long time impacting the performance of ARCs. On account of such delays in realizations, there is considerable erosion in the value of underlying assets resulting in lower realizations. Your Company is taking necessary steps to resolve legal issues by engaging senior counsel wherever required.

Unlike well-developed and vibrant markets for stressed assets in western countries, the scope for sale of distressed assets is very limited in our country. There is a need for developing a secondary market for trading in security receipts so that more investors will participate in acquisition of non-performing assets.

### Internal financial Control and its adequacy

Your Company has aligned its current systems of internal financial control with the requirement of Companies Act 2013, on lines of accepted accounting principles. The internal control is intended to increase transparency and accountability in assuring achievement of an organization's objectives in operational effectiveness and efficiency.

Your Company's internal controls are commensurate with its size and the nature of operations. These were designed to provide reasonable assurance regarding recording and providing reliable financial and operational information, complying with applicable statutes, safeguarding assets, executing transactions with proper authorization, and ensuring compliance with corporate policies. Your Company has a well-defined delegation of powers with authority and all processes and controls are aligned with the best practices.

## **Corporate Governance**

Corporate governance is the system by which companies are directed and controlled to facilitate effective, entrepreneurial, and prudent management that can deliver the long-term success of the Company. The Board of Directors is responsible for the governance of the Company. Your Company's philosophy on corporate governance ensures fiscal accountability, ethical corporate behavior and fairness to all stakeholders comprising regulators, employees, customers, and investors. Your Company has a legacy of fair, transparent and ethical governance practices.

### **Board of Directors and Committees of the Board**

The Board of your Company formulates and evaluates policies and provides strategic direction to the management in achieving corporate objectives and further ensures the statutory and regulatory compliances, safeguarding the interest of the stakeholders.

The Board has constituted four committees, namely Audit Committee, Executive Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Corporate Social Responsibility Committee.

The Board met 6 times during the year on 11.04.2022, 25.05.2022, 27.06.2022, 05.09.2022, 15.11.2022 and 11.03.2023.

### **Opinion**

### 1. Summary of significant accounting policies

### I. Basis of Preparation:

The accounting and reporting policies of the company are framed to comply with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in India, the guidelines and accounting standards issued by the Reserve Bank of India from time to time and the provisions of the Companies Act 2013. Financial statements are prepared under historical cost convention and all income and expenditure are accounted on accrual basis, except otherwise stated.

### II. Principal Accounting Policies:

Revenue Recognition:

- i) Interest on bank deposits is recognized on accrual basis.
- ii) Interest income in respect of restructured /rescheduled financial assets which are held in the books of the company is recognized on accrual basis as long as the asset remains performing.
- iii) a) Income from financial assets held in trusts is recognized after redemption of the entire principal amount of Security Receipts.
  - b) Upside income is recognized only after full redemption of Security Receipts.
- iv) Management fee in respect of accounts acquired and held in trusts is recognized in the first year at the time of acquisition. For subsequent periods management fee is recognized only when the fee recognized earlier is realized in full. Any such management fee recognized during the planning period (planning period is 6 months from the date of acquisition) is reversed if the same is not recovered within 180 days from the date of expiry of the planning period. Likewise, management fee recognized after the planning period is reversed if the same is not realized within 180 days from the date of recognition. Further, any unrealized management fee is reversed if NAV of the Security Receipts of the financial asset falls below 50% of the face value below the prescribed time for realization.
- v) Sale proceeds of secured assets/OTS payments/instalments of rescheduled debts are appropriated first towards expenses incurred for formation of trusts (either reversed or outstanding in account recoverable from trust), management fee (either reversed or outstanding in account recoverable from trust), other expenses, outstanding acquisition cost and the balance amount, if any, is recognized as gain.
- vi) Interest on expenses incurred in accounts held in trust(s) as a trustee is accounted for as and when amount is realized as per the terms of trust deed.

### III. Asset classification and provisioning there on:

The company shall classify the financial assets acquired and held in the books of the company and make necessary provisions against non-performing assets, as per the guidelines issued by Reserve Bank of India from time to time.

### IV. Rating of Security Receipts:

Security Receipts issued by the Trusts are rated by accredited Rating Agencies periodically as per guidelines of Reserve Bank of India.

### V. Investments / Valuation of Security Receipts:

Investments in Security Receipts are aggregated for the purpose of arriving at net depreciation/appreciation of investments under the category. Net depreciation if any, is provided for and net appreciation is ignored. Investments in SRs held by the company are treated as "Available for Sale Category."

#### VI. Property, Plant & Equipment:

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes purchase cost and all expenditure such as installation costs incurred on the assets before it is put to use.

Depreciation is charged on straight line method in accordance with rates specified in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

Intangible Assets are amortized over a period of three years.

### VII. Employee benefits:

The Company makes annual contribution to Gratuity Fund and Leave Encashment Fund administered by trustees and managed by LIC of India based on actuarial valuation done every year.

### VIII. Pre-Acquisition Expenditure on Financial Assets:

Expenses incurred at pre-acquisition stage for performing due diligence etc., for acquiring financial assets from banks/Fls are expensed immediately by recognizing the same in the statement of Profit and Loss for the period in which such costs are incurred.

### IX. Expenditure incurred after acquisition of Assets:

Expenses incurred after acquisition of assets on the formation of trusts like stamp duty, registration etc., which are recoverable from the trusts are charged to the respective trust accounts and the same are reversed if not realized within 180 days from the planning period or if the NAV of SRs falls below 50% of the face value, whichever is earlier.

### X. Earnings per share:

The basic EPS is computed by dividing the net profit attributable to the equity shareholders by weighted average number of shares outstanding during the reporting year.

### XI. Operating cycle concept under schedule III:

Liabilities due within one year are classified as "current liabilities" and assets maturing within one year along with cash and bank balances as "current assets".
